TWO WEEKS UNTIL

WEEK OF PREMIERE - November 22, 2023

BACKGROUNDER

Welcome to Saltburn.

Academy Award Winner, Emerald Fennel, brings audiences a wicked tale of privilege and desire. Set in England in the mid-2000s, the film follows a young university student, Oliver Quick (played by Barry Keoghan) who struggles to find his place at Oxford University and eventually finds himself drawn into the world of the charming and aristocratic Felix Cattan (Jacob Elordi). Felix invites him to his family's sprawling estate in Saltburn for a summer never to be forgotten.

About: Emerald Fennell

Emerald Lilly Fennell is an English writer, filmmaker, and actress. Receiving numerous awards, including an Academy Award, two British Academy Film Awards, one Screen Actors Guild Award, nominations for three Primetime Emmy Awards, and three Golden Globe Awards.

Fennell gained attention for her roles in period drama films such as *Albert Nobbs* (2011), *Anna Karenina* (2012), *The Danish Girl* (2015), and *Vita and Virginia* (2018). She continued to receive wider recognition for her starring role in the BBC One period drama, *Call the Midwife* (2013-2017) and later for her portrayal of Camilla Parker-Bowles in the Netflix period drama, *The Crown* (2019-2020), which garnered her a Primetime Emmy Award nomination.

As a writer and director, Fennell is known as the showrunner for season two of the BBC spy thriller series, *Killing Eve* (2019), earning her two Primetime Emmy Award nominations. Again, creating a feature film directorial debut with the thriller *Promising Young Woman* (2020). In which she won the Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay and nominations for Best Picture and Best Director.

Fennell became only one of seven women to be nominated for Best Director.

Her sophomore film, Saltburn debuts in theaters November 17, 2023.

FACT SHEET

- Saltburn was shot on film. The film itself contributed to the sensual feel of "Saltburn" and allowed Fennell to embrace the chance to be expressionistic while cutting in detail.
- The film was shot in a 1:33 aspect ratio. Choosing this ratio allowed filmmakers
 to create the story as a "peep show." Functionally, it also served the elaborate
 heights of the set and house. Large windowsills and chandeliers could easily fit
 within the frame, leaving no detail amiss.
- The Drayton House in Northamptonshire, which has never been used for filming, and may never be used again for an on-set production.
- Fennell was determined not to film an estate familiar to viewers and wanted to shoot in one location. Aligning with the film's plot, "It was important to me that we were all in there together, that the making of the film in some way had that feeling of a summer where everyone loses their mind together... I didn't want to be constantly picking up and moving." Again, avoiding the need for post-production adjustments due to multiple locations.
- "Usually in National Trust and English Heritage properties, you're not allowed to paint anything or move pictures or augment or change anything. This family let us do quite a bit to the house and gave us free rein" Susie Davies says of Saltburn.
- Emerald Fennell knew it was the one when "[she] first went into the house, the busts in the great hall had silly hats on them and I was like, 'That's exactly it. This is exactly what it needs to feel like,'". She continues, "'To the people who live here it's just home and it's just funny. These grand things are just the clutter of your everyday life. That was something I felt we hadn't really seen before."
